ROMAN TREASURES

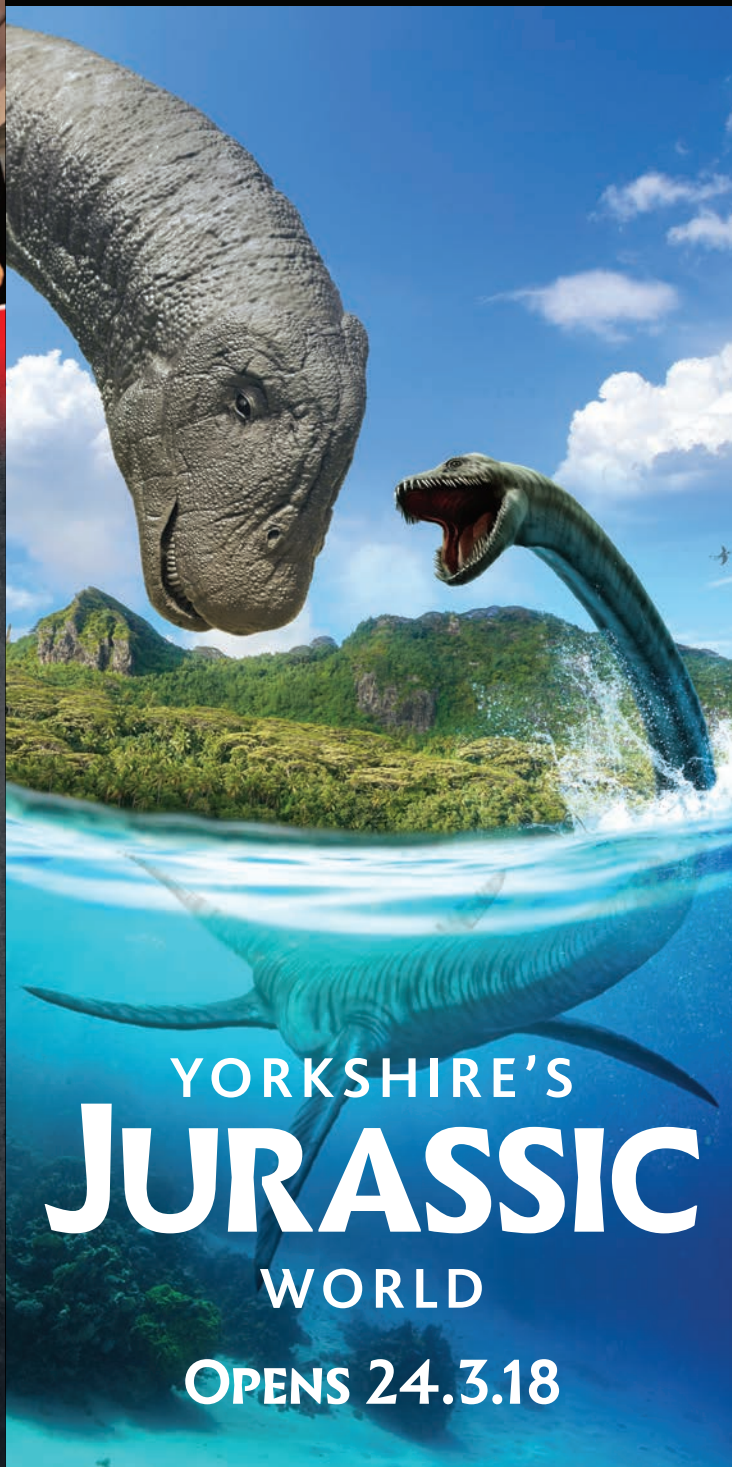
