The Project

What we know already

Where you live has been a part of York's history from the very beginning. A Roman Villa was found while building terraced houses in the 19th Century, then it was mentioned in the Doomsday Book and was the place where people would monitor nuclear explosions and fallout in Yorkshire.

We are partnering with York Explore to support local residents to research and find out more about the people who came before you.



How to get involved

We will be hosting a series of events for people to learn how to dig into their past!
